





6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Curriculum is designed by Periyar University, Salem. Our staff members are there on various board of studies of University. They collect suggestions from faculty and students regarding curriculum improvement and necessary modifications are made.



#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

We have a number of technology assisted quality improvement strategies in the institution. College's library is having well stock of books, journals, e-books and digital resources, and it is complemented by the department libraries. Modern teaching methods using Wi-Fi broadband internet, INFLIBNET, interactive boards, LCD projectors are increasingly employed in the classrooms. College provides opportunity to the teachers to attend orientation and refresher courses to make improvements in teaching. A Digital Language Lab is set up to improve the language proficiency among teachers and students. The centralized computing facility enhances the IT skills of our students and facilitates better teaching and learning. Members of the faculty encourage students to acquire knowledge from divergent sources. Extension lectures by academic scholars are offered to the students. Academic progress of students is assessed through class tests. The tutorial system helps students to overcome learning difficulties.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The university valuation methodology is adopted in the tests conducted by the respective departments. This methodology is discussed with students before they are writing the examinations. The Students used to write two internal tests and one model examinations before end semester examinations. It will enable the students to get good marks in the university examinations. Slow learners are given special coaching to get through the examinations.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

The Research & Development Cell of the college encourages and motivates the teachers to take up research projects, and fosters a culture of research among students and staff. The committee is also involved in synchronising and facilitating research activities carried out by the members of the faculty by providing relevant information, and updates the faculty members on the availability of funds and their sources. Publication of research findings and presentation of research papers are undertaken by the faculty members.



#### 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

There are two libraries (Central / Digital) libraries are functioning in the college campus, they hold approximately 35,000 volumes of text and reference books in various disciplines. The library subscribes 58 printed journals and magazines, 9 leading news papers.

The library using library management software **Lip I Net** for library automation. The library having internet connection with 04 computers. The library has sufficient space with comfortable furniture and lighting facilities has created for readers. A Reprographic facility has installed for the benefits of students and staff.

The library is providing Book Bank service for underprivileged students and more over reference section and periodical sections have been very effectives assist research scholars.

A Competitive Exam Book section has created for students those who are preparing for competitive exams. The collection includes Encyclopedia of Britannica, Year Books, Hand Books, Dictionaries, General Knowledge and Current Affairs, Maps, etc, which helps students to prepare for Exams like GATE, GRE, TOIFEI, GMAT, UPSC, TNPSC, other Staff Selection Commission Exams.

The library is one of the member institute of INFLIBNET digital Library Consortium, through this consortium N-List project can access more than 3800+ e-journals, 80,000 e-books and Bibliographic Database called MathsciNet containing more than two million reviews of research articles in mathematics. #### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The career guidance cell conducts Coaching classes for the students to take up banks, railways, TNPSC and Central Government examinations. Our students are regularly participating in the Periyar University off campus drive.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

All faculty positions are filled-up through TRB as per the norms laid down by the UGC and the Tamil Nadu Government.
